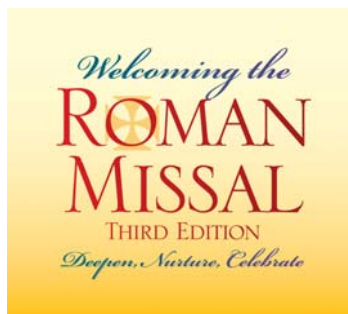

# WELCOMING THE ROMAN MISSAL CLASSROOM ACTIVITIES

**Included in this packet are the following:**

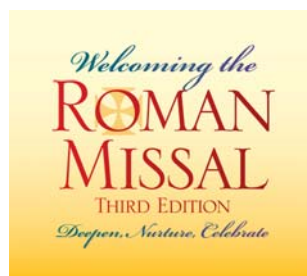
"A Catechetical Plan for Implementing the Roman Missal" by Lois DeFelice gives you an outline to follow to undertake a comprehensive study of Liturgy. Done in 8 weeks at 15 minutes a class session, this plan helps students be ready to participate more fully in the Liturgy.

Blackline Masters and answer keys of various activities are included that can be used with your students (all grades) to enhance their learning of the changes to the revised Roman Missal as well as deepen their understanding of the Mass.

These activities include a crossword puzzle, word search, fill in the blank, sequencing activity, matching activities and discussion question. You may also want to encourage your students to create puzzles/activities on the computer to further enhance their learning experience and share their creations with their fellow students.

"The People's Mass Parts" is a pew card with the new words that you can use with your students to practice the new parts.

"Preparing for Masses with Children and Youth" provides you with a review on what you need to do to plan Masses with your students.





## **A CATECHETICAL PLAN FOR IMPLEMENTING THE ROMAN MISSAL**

**To assist in an understanding of the Roman Missal to be used in Advent 2011, this outline gives a general view of a possible way to do a comprehensive study of Liturgy so that those in any catechetical process will be ready to participate more fully in the Liturgy.**

**If possible provide a fifteen minute time to study the Liturgy each class session. Some of the suggestions here are to assist in learning the new translation, others are to deepen our understanding of how we celebrate liturgy.**

### **WEEK I      INTRODUCTORY RITES**

- **Review/introduce the response for the Greeting. (refer to the Scripture references for the greetings)**
- **Pray together the Confiteor and the penitential rite response.**

### **WEEK II     THE GLORIA**

- **Read together the story of the announcement of Gabriel to Mary and to Zechariah in Luke's Infancy Narratives. (Chapter 1 & 2)**
- **Pray together the Gloria, listen to the music for the one that will be used in your parish. Sing together the Gloria.**

### **WEEK III    THE LITURGY OF THE WORD**

- **Review the structure of the Liturgy of the Word. Talk about the three cycles of readings.**
- **Review the responses after each reading, and review the response that will be used before the Gospel, "And with your Spirit".**

### **WEEK IV    THE PROFESSION OF FAITH**

- **The Nicene Creed is both a prayer and a statement of belief. Talk about the importance of what we say we believe.**
- **Distribute copies of the Creed, look at the words that are not normally in our vocabulary and talk about what those words mean.**
- **Pray the creed together.**

## **WEEK V THE PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL**

### **AND THE PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS**

- **The Prayer of the Faithful concludes the Liturgy of the Word. It is a set of prayers that follow a certain pattern. Review with the students what that pattern is and how we go beyond our own needs.**
- **The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the preparation of the gifts. Discuss the offertory procession, the prayers the priest says, the gifts that are brought to the altar, the washing of the hands, and lastly our response which has one additional word in the text.**

## **WEEK VI EUCHARISTIC PRAYERS**

- **Practice the dialogue that begins the Eucharistic Prayer. Sing the Holy, Holy.**
- **Remind all that the Eucharistic Prayer is a prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification. There is an order to this prayer no matter which text the celebrant chooses. If time permits, talk about the order.**
- **Practice the Memorial Acclamation.**
- **The Amen closes the Eucharistic Prayer. Discuss how this amen is our affirmation of what has gone on in this prayer. Amen, so be it, Yes, I believe needs to be said or sung with conviction.**

## **WEEK VII THE COMMUNION RITE**

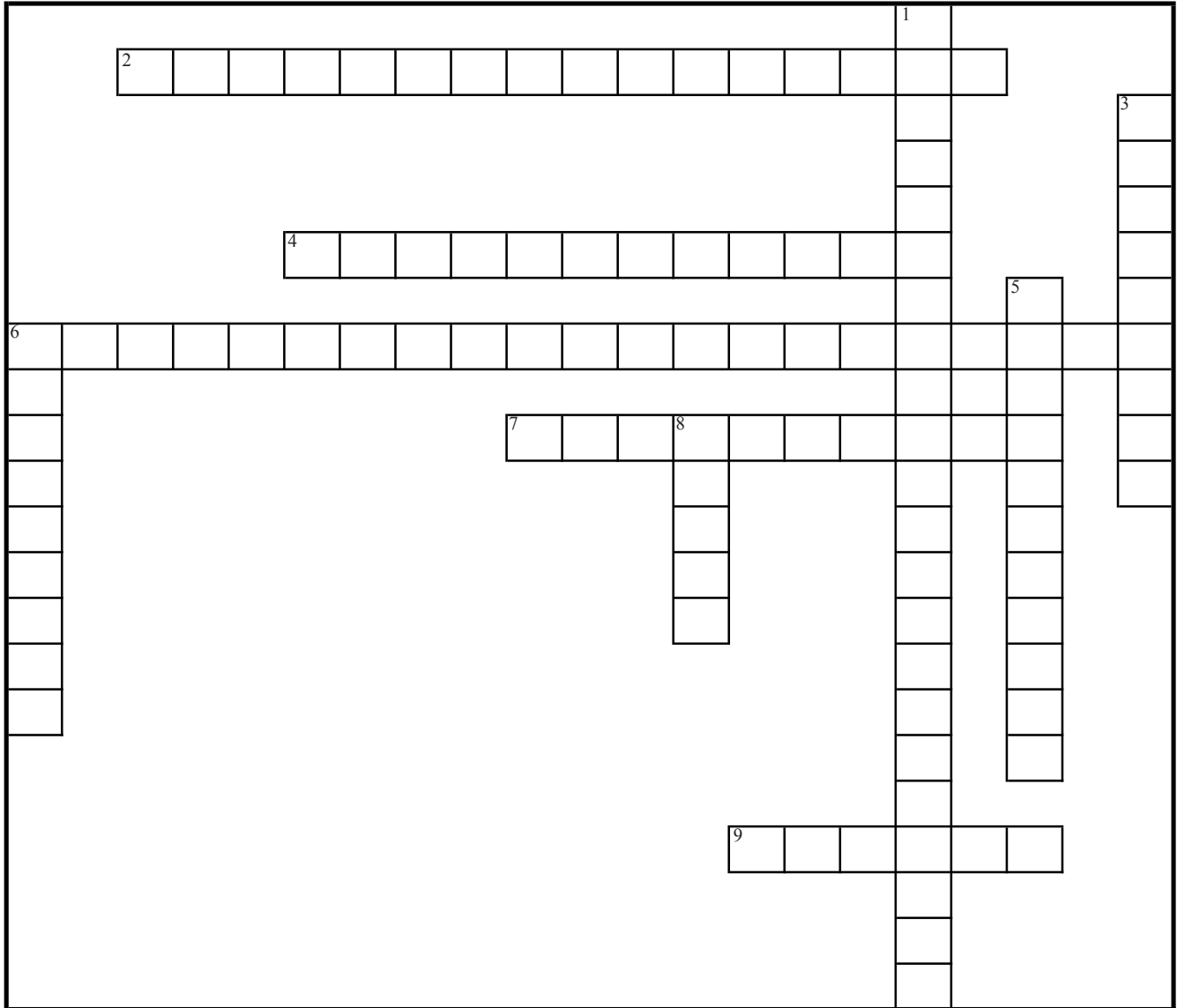
- **The Our Father, Sign of Peace and Lamb of God occur during this rite. Discuss how your parish shares in these prayers and actions. The only response to review in this part is the “And with your Spirit.”**
- **At the distribution of the Holy Eucharist, the words we pray have changed. Share the Scripture story of the Centurion invites the Lord to his home, Matthew 8:8 or Luke 7:6. Pray together the words we will pray. Review the reception of Eucharist, with the reverent bow and Amen, again being said with conviction.**

## **WEEK VIII THE CONCLUDING RITE**

- **The *GIRM* #90 states, “the concluding rites consist of...the dismissal of the people by the deacon or the priest, so that each may go out to do good works, praising and blessing God.”**
- **Introduce the new options that the priest or deacon has for the dismissal, our response remains, “thanks be to God”. Remember that we are to go out and bring the Good News to those we encounter.**

## **PREPARING FOR MASSES WITH CHILDREN AND YOUTH**

- ❖ Note that the *Lectionary for Masses with Children* and the three Eucharistic Prayers for Masses with Children have not yet changed—if you use these in your parish and/or elementary school.
- ❖ Review the readings for the Mass to denote the general theme.
- ❖ Utilize the Mass preparation sheet/guide that your pastor/principal has traditionally used.
- ❖ Select music for the Mass—consult your liturgist/musician to see what Mass settings and which songs are appropriate for the Mass theme and in compliance with the revised Roman Missal guidelines.
- ❖ With the students, develop the petitions for the Prayer of the Faithful (General Intercessions). Remember that these petitions should address the following: (1) for the needs of the Church; (2) for public authorities and the salvation of the whole world; (3) for those burdened by any kind of difficulty – including the sick and the dead; and (4) for the local community.
- ❖ Assign reading parts, gift bearers, servers (unless already scheduled), etc. as needed.
- ❖ Be sure that Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are designated for the Mass.
- ❖ Share your completed Mass preparation sheet with your pastor, principal, and liturgist/musician in plenty of time to allow for modifications.
- ❖ Continue practicing the revised Roman Missal’s new English words with the students so the use of them is natural.
