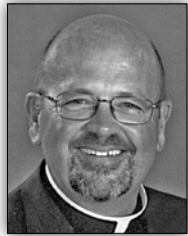

Blessed Pope John Paul II encouraged pilgrimages to the Holy Land to express solidarity with the local Christian community. Recalling his own 2000 pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Blessed John Paul II said, “Indeed, the Holy Land does not need walls, but bridges.” You are invited to be, like Blessed John Paul himself, a bridge of solidarity and understanding.

Co-sponsored by Catholic Charities USA and Catholic Relief Services, with the Office for the Missions in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the Office for Missions in the Diocese of Joliet as your hosts, this pilgrimage will include visits to all the Holy Places, the “Ancient Stones,” important to the People of God. We will also take time to visit the descendants of the people with whom Jesus lived, the “Living Stones;” Palestinian Christians who live in Israel.

Each day will be steeped in scripture reflections, prayer times, and liturgy. We will also have an opportunity to learn from local Christians, Muslims and Jews, hear from peace-makers and Middle-east issues experts, and witness efforts to bring peace and justice through economic development and empowerment. This will not be a tourist trip, but a pilgrimage of prayer, solidarity and the quest for peace.

OUR DAILY ITINERARY

MON, NOV 26, DAY 1: DEPART USA: We depart Chicago en route to Tel Aviv, Israel with complimentary meals and beverages served aloft.

TUE, NOV 27, DAY 2: ARRIVAL TEL AVIV / JERUSALEM: Upon arrival in Tel Aviv, we are met by our Catholic Travel Center representative and escorted by bus to Jerusalem. Next we settle into our accommodations at the Notre Dame Guest House in Jerusalem, followed by dinner and an orientation. (D)

WED, NOV 28, DAY 3: JERUSALEM: MT. OF OLIVES, GETHSEMANE, ST. PETER IN GALLICANTU, CHURCH OF THE UPPER ROOM: This day we begin on the Mt. of Olives where we take in the panoramic views of Jerusalem. We visit Bethpage, the traditional starting point of the Palm Sunday procession and follow the path that Jesus took that day. At Dominus Flevit we remember where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. Before leaving here we celebrate Mass as we pray for the peace of Jerusalem. Lunch is at a local restaurant. We visit the Garden of Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations. We will have an afternoon of reflection at the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu where Peter denied Christ; we reflect upon our own faithfulness and pray for grace to fulfill the new commitments we have made to Christ during this pilgrimage. We also visit the Cenacle Church and commemorate Pentecost. Our guide will take us on a short orientation tour in the old city. Dinner is served at our accommodations. (B, L, D)

THU, NOV 29, DAY 4: JERUSALEM: WAILING WALL, VISIT OF THE CITY, CHURCH OF ST. ANNE, TAYBEH: This morning, we will visit the Western or Wailing Wall of the Temple, the Temple Mount, and view the Dome of the Rock [a Muslim Shrine]

from the outside. We will visit the Holocaust Museum, Yad Vashem. We will visit Roudat Alzuhar School, a Palestinian grade school. We then move to St. Stephen's Gate and the Church of St. Anne. We will visit the Pool of Bethesda where Jesus healed the paralytic. We visit the village of Taybeh, have some time to meet with a local community, celebrate Mass and enjoy lunch with them. (B, L, D)

FRI, NOV 30, DAY 5: JERUSALEM: EXCURSION TO BETHLEHEM: We start our day by celebrating Mass at the Shepherd's field. Later, we shop at a local Palestinian shop in Bethlehem. After a visit to Shepherd's Field we stop for a prayerful visit at the Church of the Nativity. We will have lunch at Bethlehem University where we will interact with Palestinian students and professors. We hear their stories of pain and their dreams of hope, return to our accommodations for dinner. We will meet with a local Christian Palestinian family to hear of life for them as Christians living in the Holy Land. After dinner there will be an historical perspective to the Palestinian / Israeli story, an orientation to our coming days in Galilee and reflection on our day. (B, L, D)

SAT, DEC 1, DAY 6: JERUSALEM / CAESAREA / NAZARETH: We come to Caesarea Maritima, a seaport on the Mediterranean Sea, located about 30 miles north of Joppa and 70 miles northwest of Jerusalem. This was built by Herod the Great as his summer palace and built in honor of Caesar Augustus. Caesarea became the home of the Roman procurators, including Pontius Pilate. Peter preached to Cornelius here (Acts 10); Paul spent two years in prison here (Acts 23 & 26); Philip lived here and had four daughters who prophesied (Acts 8:40; 21: 8-9). Church of St. Gabriel and the Mary's Well. We enjoy lunch at a local restaurant.

Afterward we visit the synagogue where Jesus began his ministry. His inaugural address, found in Luke chapter four, will focus our journey. After a visit to St. Joseph's Church, we will celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation. Dinner will be served at our accommodation. (B, L, D)

SUN, DEC 2, DAY 7: NAZARETH: JORDAN RIVER, BAPTISMAL VOWS RENEWAL, MOUNT OF BEATITUDES & THE SEA OF GALILEE: We make our way to the Jordan River. Wading into the waters, we renew our baptismal vows. We begin our reflective morning by going to the Mount of Beatitudes where we consider the Kingdom of God. We join together for a silent walk down the Mount to the shore of the Sea of Galilee. After some reflection and sharing, we board the "Jesus Boat" for a peaceful journey across the Sea of Galilee. After lunch we then make our way around the shore to Capernaum where Jesus spent 2-½ years of his life. We celebrate Mass at the Chapel of Peter's Primacy. Before ending the day we visit Tabgha and the shore of the sea. We also visit the excavation of a street of Nazareth from the 1st century under the Sisters' of Nazareth. Dinner is served at our accommodations. (B, L, D)

MON, DEC 3, DAY 8: NAZARETH: SEPPHORIS, SHEFA-AMR: This morning we have a meeting with Archbishop Chacour. Then we visit to the ruins of Sepphoris, a major town during Jesus' day, which is only 3 miles from Nazareth. Depart for Shefa-Amr we celebrate Mass at St. Peter & St. Paul's Melkite Catholic Church. We meet with Palestinian Christian peacemaker Fr. Fouad Dagher at his church and visit the school. Then we will have lunch with Fr. Fouad at Shefa Amer. We will end the day with reflection and prayer. Dinner will be served at our accommodation. (B, L, D)

TUE, DEC 4, DAY 9: NAZARETH / JERICHO /JERUSALEM: We will visit Mt. Tabor where Jesus was transfigured while he was in prayer with Peter, James and John. The Holy Spirit upon us, we travel south through the wilderness to the Mount of Temptation. We pause to see where Jesus was tempted in the wilderness. We have lunch at Al-Rawda Restaurant in Jericho. After lunch we meet with members from the Palestinian Authority. We will visit the local pottery shop and continue our journey up to Jerusalem. Mass will be celebrated at our accommodations. Before dinner we meet with representatives from the Jerusalem office of Catholic Relief Services. (B, L, D)

WED, DEC 5, DAY 10: JERUSALEM: LATIN PATRIARCH & CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES: Today we meet with Chancellor from Latin Patriarch's office (subject to his availability) We celebrate Mass at the (Co-Cathedral). We will be hosted by the staff of Catholic Relief Services of Jerusalem and visit the projects in the West Bank. We immerse ourselves in the realities of their life and witness their efforts for peace, justice and development. We will then enjoy lunch in their company. We also visit the Women's Craft Project and the Palestinian AIDA Refugee Camp next to Rachel's tomb. We will end the day with reflection. (B, L, D)

THU, DEC 6, DAY 11: JERUSALEM: HOLY SEPULCHRE & EMMAUS: Early Morning we walk the Way of the Cross. Dawn's first light finds us celebrating Mass at Christianity's holiest site, the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher inside the Empty Tomb of Jesus Christ. We return to our accommodations for breakfast. We then continue to Emmaus. During the day there will be time for shopping. Lunch and dinner are served at our accommodations. (B, L, D)

FRI, DEC 7, DAY 12: RETURN TO USA: We transfer to the Tel Aviv airport to board our return flight en route home,

our hearts full from this life-changing pilgrimage to the Holy Land. (B)

Note: While no changes are anticipated, there may be unforeseen occasions when certain alterations become necessary to this itinerary, either due to changes in airline schedules or for other reasons. All Masses are subject to local church schedules and substitution with alternate Mass sites if churches mentioned are not available. All special meetings are subject to final confirmation and change.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

To make your reservation, simply complete the enclosed registration form and submit along with \$400 payment (mailed to the address shown on the bottom of the registration form). Terms and Conditions

Making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this tour brochure. Catholic Travel Centre shall be referred to as CTC within this document.

DOCUMENTS: US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies. Passports must be valid for six months beyond the tour's return date.

TRAVEL WARNING: Please be advised that there is a Travel Warning issued by the Department of State for travel to Israel, the West Bank and Gaza. This warning may still be in effect on the day of your travel and cancellation for this reason will not constitute grounds for refund of the cancellation fees listed below.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSITS: A deposit of \$400 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form. Registrations cannot be taken by telephone. Registrations are processed in the order received by CTC. Balance of payment is due 90 days prior to departure. Late payment is subject to \$50 late fee. Late registrations (fewer than 90 days) must be accompanied by full payment by cashiers check only (including the optional passenger travel protection program payment, if applicable), plus a \$50 late fee and are subject to availability. CTC reserves the right to cancel reservations that are not paid in full 75 days prior to departure and to charge cancellation fees/penalties indicated below. A \$25 fee will be charged on all checks returned by our bank.

CHANGES IN INVOICING: Please note that after initial invoicing, any requests for change in form of payment (cash discount vs. standard base) or in package (air inclusive vs. "land only") are subject to a \$50 per person per change processing fee.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: All cancellations must be received by CTC in writing via certified mail or facsimile. CTC will process your refund, minus a cancellation fee according to the following schedule:

- 1) \$150 if cancelled at least 150 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 2) \$300 if cancelled 149 to 90 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 3) \$400 plus any non-refundable amounts paid to and/or penalties assessed by airlines, hotels, or other suppliers of travel services (up to the total cost of the tour) if cancelled 89 to 8 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 4) No refunds for cancellations received within 7 days of departure date.

The above cancellation fees and/or penalties will also apply if you register for an optional extension or airline routing, and you decide to cancel or change any of these. CTC strongly recommends the Passenger Travel Protection Program (see "PASSENGER TRAVEL PROTECTION PROGRAM" below.)

In the event of any alteration to the itinerary, every effort will be made to substitute the altered activity with a comparable replacement. If a tour is cancelled in its entirety, full refunds shall be issued within two weeks of such cancellation. This will constitute, in full, CTC's obligation to you and CTC bears no further responsibility beyond the full refund. CTC shall not be held liable and hereby expressly disclaims liability for any loss, expense, damage or inconvenience caused as a result of any tour cancellation or changes made to the itinerary.
