



Personal Safety Training

The purpose of the Illinois Coalition Against Sexual Assault (ICASA) is two-fold: to end sexual assault violence and to alleviate the suffering of sexual assault victims. To accomplish these goals, ICASA advocates for public policy that prevents sexual violence and guarantees sensitivity to victims. ICASA uses the power of public education to change societal attitudes about the causes and consequences of sexual violence. ICASA assists with healing from the trauma of sexual violence through creation and support of community programs that provide advocacy, counseling and education.

ICASA is a not-for-profit corporation of 34 community-based sexual assault crisis centers working together to end sexual violence. Each center provides 24 hour crisis intervention services, counseling and advocacy for victims of sexual assault and their significant others.

They have curricula for conducting education and training programs. Each center presents prevention education programs in Illinois schools and communities. Prevention education programs are conducted through a trained ICASA prevention educator that provides students with age appropriate information.
